

Short History of Charlotta Broman Kylan

Charlotte Broman Kylan was born Apr 4, 1864, married to Carl J. Kylan Apr 2, 1888. Later she was converted to the LDS Church Apr 2, 1892 by her father Jacob Broman. At that time he was in Sweden on a mission, she was baptized Apr 3, 1893, by her father. Sister Kylan arrived with her husband from Sweden, and settled in Salt Lake City in the year 1893, things were bad at that time her husband worked on the water and sewer lines which were being laid through the city at that time, the pay was one dollar a day for ten hours work, it was hard to make end's meet as there was rent to pay and other expenses. They lived in Salt Lake about one year. Later moving to Mill Creek and living in one room log cabin with a dirt floor. They bought a cow things were better for them to get along. Then later moved to what was known then, as Dry Creek.

After that Bro. and Sis. Kylan & family took up a homestead on the flat more hard times because of no water for the crops. They had to haul water from the canal to use for the house.

After that they moved to Riverton and farmed Charly Dansie place in Riverton for one year. Then they decided to buy a place instead of renting all the time. They bought a place in Bluffdale, after that they made pretty good living for themselves.

They had four children born to them. Also 10 grandchildren, 30 great grandchildren, and 2 great-great grandchildren.
